

This Introduction to LGBTIQA+ Inclusion in Sport course guides all players, officials and administrators involved in sport and recreation through a range of interactive learning activities focusing on issues facing LGBTIQA+ people in sporting settings and the ways inclusive practices can make a difference. Featuring videos of LGBTIQA+ Tasmanians talking about their experiences of sport, and a case study of an award-winning club.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this course participants will be able to:

- Understand the importance of accepting and affirming LGBTIQA+ identities in sport and recreational activities
- Engage respectfully with LGBTIQA+ people in sport and recreation
- Use appropriate language and terminology in relation to LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Embed LGBTIQA+ inclusive practices into everyday behaviours

Being LGBTIQA+ Inclusive

About this session

Our Being LGBTIQA+ Inclusive training is the standard training package for organisations, employees and others. It will introduce participants to LGBTIQA+ inclusion through a range of interactive learning activities. Participants will become familiar with LGBTIQA+ terminology and how to embed inclusive behaviours into everyday activities and organisational practices.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Describe issues of discrimination and harassment faced by members of the Tasmanian LGBTIQA+ communities and their consequences
- Identify personal biases and misconceptions
- Adhere to appropriate legislative requirements in relation to LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Use appropriate language and terminology in relation to LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Embed LGBTIQA+ inclusive practices into everyday behaviours and organisational practices

Content*

- Unpacking gender, sex and sexuality identities definitions and terminology
- · Pronouns and misgendering
- State and Federal anti-discrimination laws relating to gender, sex and sexuality

How2 - Rainbow Tick Accreditation

About this session

The HOW2 Program takes participants through a series of practical steps to help them develop and implement a plan for LGBTIQA+ inclusive practice specific to their organisation. HOW2 is designed around the six national standards that make up the Rainbow Tick accreditation, however, the decision of whether to apply for the Tick is up to individual participants and not a requirement of the program.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Articulate the evidence base for LGBTIQA+ inclusive practices in organisations for both service users and staff
- Begin applying key frameworks for improving outcomes for LGBTIQA+ staff and service users at their organisation
- Develop a plan for embedding LGBTIQA+ inclusion in their organisation

Content

- Foundational understanding and evidence that underpins LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Practical tools, skills, and strategies for transforming and embedding LGBTIQA+ inclusive systems, practices and culture within an organisation
- Engaging videos and interactive activities that guide participants in developing, and beginning to implement, a plan for facilitating LGBTIQA+ inclusion in their organisation
- Unpacking the Rainbow Tick accreditation process and each of the six Standards

Organisations who wish to develop and implement an LGBTIQA+ inclusivity strategy and/or who are considering applying for Rainbow Tick Accreditation.

Who should attend?

It is recommended each organisation send 2-4 management-level staff to all sessions.

Participants should be in a position to influence cultural change within their organisation, so should be engaged in areas such as quality, accreditation, service design, evaluation, diversity and engagement.

4 x 1 day sessions over 5-6 months with 5-8 weeks between sessions to allow time to undertake out of session work.

About this session

Change led from the top is powerful. This workshop will introduce participants to key concepts of LGBTIQA+ inclusive practice and provide strategies for developing LGBTIQA+ inclusive organisations.

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Use appropriate language and terminology in relation to LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Describe systemic issues faced by LGBTIQA+ individuals and communities
- Develop strategies to successfully embed
 LGBTIQA+ inclusive practices in an organisation

Rodney is one of Australia's most successful advocates for LGBTIQA+ human rights. His activism has been recognised in Australia and beyond. He has been awarded a number of honours including becoming a Member of the Order of Australia (2003), Tasmanian Australian of the Year and Australian of the Year finalist (2015) and an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Tasmania (2019).

Rodney's achievements over three decades of advocacy include leading the transformation of Tasmania's LGBTIQA+ laws from the worst in Australia to the best in the world, and leading many successful national campaigns, from lifting the ban on gay and lesbian defence service personnel through to marriage equality.

LGBTIQA+ Cultural Safety in Schools

About this session

This session is suitable for all staff in schools (including admin, EFAs, TAs, etc.) regardless of their existing levels of knowledge. Content is situated within the Tasmanian context and tailored towards the educational setting. The emphasis is on creating meaningful cultural change in schools by addressing discrimination, intentional inclusion and diverse representation.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Describe the differences between biological sex, gender & sexuality
- Understand the context and ongoing impact of contemporary and historical Tasmanian LGBTIQA+ experiences
- Be an effective LGBTIQA+ ally and take appropriate action to support students, families & colleagues
- Apply a systemic, whole-of-school approach to supporting LGBTIQA+ students
- Support the Valuing Diversity Framework within their school environment

Content (depending on time)

- Introduction to Working It Out and the Valuing Diversity Framework
- Relevant language, definitions and terminology (including pronouns)
- The concepts of cultural safety, the box of belonging and the price of progress
- Legal requirements, DECYP policies and guidelines, and ethical responsibilities
- Systemic barriers for LGBTIQA+ students in schools
- The role allies can play in making school a safe, supportive and inclusive place for LGBTIQA+ people
- · Opportunities to take action for positive change

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Describe key health outcomes for LGBTIQA+ individuals
- Describe potential issues of stigma, discrimination and inappropriate service delivery in health faced by LGBTIQA+ people
- Adhere to appropriate legislative requirements in relation to LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Use appropriate language and terminology to support LGBTIQA+ inclusion
- Embed LGBTIQA+ inclusive practices into everyday behaviours and organisational practices

Positive Mental Health Outcomes for LGBTIQA+ Clients

About this session

LGBTIQA+ people experience some of the worst mental health outcomes of any population group in Australia. This course examines the underlying drivers of these poor outcomes, and gives practitioners the tools to provide evidence-based and affirming care to LGBTIQA+ clients.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Describe mental health issues impacting LGBTIQA+
 - Individuals and groups
- Describe the impact of historic and contemporary stigma, discrimination, harassment and abuse
- Adhere to appropriate legislative requirements in relation to service delivery
- Use appropriate language and terminology to support LGBTIQA+ clients
- Embed LGBTIQA+ inclusive practices into everyday behaviours and organisational practices
- Apply evidence based strategies for improving mental health outcomes for LGBTIQA+ clients.

- Statistics in relation to mental health outcomes for LGBTIQA+ people and the underling drivers



Silver Rainbow Ageing and Aged Care Training

About this session

Silver Rainbow training introduces participants to the principles of LGBTI inclusive practice in Aged Care. The training addresses the Aged Care Quality Standards and their relationship to LGBTI cultural safety in aged care. This training uses interactive activities, case studies and research-based evidence to build participant's skills in inclusive practice. Delivered as part of the broader Silver Rainbow aged care capacity building project.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

- Adhere to legal and workplace requirements around LGBTI inclusive service delivery in aged care
- Demonstrate an understanding of issues related to ageing and health for LGBTI population groups
- Use appropriate and inclusive language in the workplace
- · Identify personal biases and misconceptions
- Identify and embed LGBTI inclusive practices in everyday work situations

Content

- Exploring issues for LGBTI people as they age
- Unpacking gender, sex and sexuality identities definitions and terminology
- Everyday experiences of stigma, discrimination and isolation in aged care and their impacts
